Launched successfully in 2023 by Nice Côte d’Azur Airport, this annual day **honors the millions of passengers** who place their trust in airports every day—whether traveling for business, leisure, or family reasons. More than just a place of transit, the airport is a **hub of experiences, services, hospitality, and human connection**.

The **2025 edition** reflects a **reinforced spirit of collaboration**, with **28 participating airports** renewing their shared commitment to service quality, innovation, and passenger care.

A Global Initiative

On **November 17, 2025**, these airports from France and around the world will host simultaneous **special touches and gestures of appreciation for passengers**, creating a **warm and welcoming atmosphere**. The goal is to offer travelers a unique and memorable moment that recognizes their central role within the air transport ecosystem.

Airports participating in the initiative :

- **Mainland France** : Nice, Marseille, Brest, Montpellier, Perpignan, Carcassonne, Tarbes Lourdes Pyrénées, Strasbourg
- **Overseas territories** : La Réunion
- **Corsica** : Bastia, Ajaccio, Calvi, Figari
- **International** : Antananarivo and Nosy Be (Madagascar), Charleroi (Belgium), Geneva (Switzerland), Rome Fiumicino (Italy)

Supporting airports:

Alongside the local celebrations, the airports of Bordeaux, Lille, and Biarritz, together with the EGIS network (airports Beauvais and Pau) and the EDEIS network (airports Dole, Mayotte, Nîmes, Saint-Martin, and Tours), are supporting this exceptional day by promoting and sharing the initiative.
